Overview

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for the Associates in Arts at the Kentucky Community and Technical College System and leads to the Bachelor of Social Work at Campbellsville University.

Admission to CU does not guarantee admission to the BSW program. You will need to complete an additional application process for the Carver School of Social Work. Please be mindful of additional cumulative grade point average criteria related to the BSW program.

- Full admission to the CSSW BSW program requires 2.75 GPA or above.
- Conditional acceptance to the CSSW BSW program may be considered with a 2.50 GPA.
- Entrance into field practicum requires a GPA of 2.75 or above.
