Please be mindful of additional cumulative grade point average criteria related to the BSW program.

- Full admission to the CSSW BSW program requires 2.75 GPA or above.
- Conditional acceptance to the CSSW BSW program may be considered with a 2.50 GPA.
- Entrance into field practicum requires a GPA of 2.75 or above.
